**Who to Contact:** Each class has a dedicated class tutor who is the first point of contact. These tutors are timetable dependant and will be allocated to your sons/daughters in August. Please direct your initial queries to either the tutor or **Mr Diarmuid O’ Donovan**, T.Y. Co-ordinator. We ask that when a concern arises that you as parents/ guardians would contact the appropriate person as soon as possible. To ensure that you get to meet Teachers/Tutors/ Year Head/ Deputy Principal / Principal please try to make a prior appointment.

**Transition Year Journal:** The Transition Year journal is part of the pupil’s book list for the year. It is used to record all assessment for the pupil as well as out of school activities and work experience. It is an integral part of the Transition Year experience and is essential that pupils have this journal with them at all times .We ask that parents/ guardians sign their offspring’s journal weekly and write all notes in the relevant section in the journal as it is a two way means of communication between home and school. The cost of the school journal, €20, is

included in the TY Levy. **As the journal is part of School Rules should a pupil not produce a diary upon request it will be handled under the Code of Behaviour.** We also ask that parents bring this journal with them to the Parent Teacher meeting.

**Transition Year Assessment / Merit system:** It is important to note that the type of homework/study given in T.Y. can vary greatly from Junior Certificate. Guidance will be given to all pupils in the area of research, meeting deadlines, oral & aural presentations, projects and traditional assessment during the year. Students will get homework in their core subjects and will have assignments to have finished at the end of each of their 6 week modules. Each module will be assessed as per the Assessment system below. We ask that all parents work with us in ensuring that their sons/ daughters attain their potential during their time with us in Transition Year.
